
DEVELOPING WELL (5-24 YEARS)

AN OVERVIEW OF PAIGNTON – 2018/20



The purpose of this profile is to give an overview of the needs of the 5-24 yrs population of Paignton. This is to provide a local summary of key statistics to help understand the population and improve outcomes.




Headlines* (children 5-24 years compared to Torbay and CIPFA nearest neighbours):

- There are less children living in poverty;
- Fewer are in a lone parent household;
- Significantly more have special educational needs or disabilities;
- There are more unpaid carers;
- Less are meeting the expected standard at Key Stage 2;
- Pupil absenteeism is significantly higher;
- Dental extractions due to decay are higher;
- Emergency self-harm admissions are lower;
- Emergency admissions are lower;
- There are fewer ambulance call outs that result in a trip to hospital.


Fig 1: Population distribution of Paignton

In 2015 there were around 10,150 young people aged 5-24 years living in Paignton (around 20% of the total Paignton population). Compared to England, Paignton has a lower proportion of 5-24 year olds as shown in Figure 1.
